The Regular Session of the Jackson County Board of Supervisors was called to order at 5:30 P.M., on Monday, March 18, 2024, at the Jackson County Courthouse in the County Board Room by Chairman Amo.

County Clerk, Cindy Altman, took roll call with 17 members present and 2 excused (Supervisor Staff and Supervisor Boe).

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

RESOLUTION # 06-03-2024

RESOLUTION TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY FOR CONSTRUCTING A COUNTY HIGHWAY INCLUDING A BLACK RIVER CROSSING

WHEREAS, The Jackson County Highway Commissioner is responsible for long range planning for safe, reliable, convenient and logical travel routes; and

WHEREAS, a third river crossing south of Black River Falls has been discussed in several highway improvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, the current traffic in and around Black River Falls must cross the Black River using bridges on I-94 or East Main Street; and

WHEREAS, having only these two river crossings does create unsafe conditions during daily commuting, emergency events and bridge maintenance; and

WHEREAS, an example of unsafe conditions includes, traffic congestion at both Main Street traffic signals, with large trucks and cars backed up for over a block in each direction; and

WHEREAS, a feasibility study is the best way to determine if constructing a highway with a bridge crossing south of Black River Falls is possible; and

WHEREAS, a feasibility study would also determine the best location for a third river crossing; and

WHEREAS, the estimated cost of a feasibility study would be approximately \$25,000.00

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that a sum of \$25,000 be allocated to complete this study, using funds from the American Transmission Company Environmental Impact Fund that has been paid to Jackson County.

WHEREAS: The Positive Youth Development Institute has developed a staffing plan for 4-H educators based on a county's current membership and the youth population in a county; and

WHEREAS: This staffing plan makes Jackson County eligible for a 1.0 4-H Program Educator; and

WHEREAS: The Division of Extension is willing to commit to paying the state share of the position since the current position is vacant; and

WHEREAS: Jackson County has traditionally employed a 1.0 FTE 4-H Educator until the Division of Extension's formal reorganization in 2017, and

WHEREAS: The cost of the additional 0.5 FTE (\$23,125) to the county can be found in the 2024 adopted Extension budget through salary savings;

Therefore let it be resolved by the Jackson County Board of Supervisors that the 4-H Program Educator Position be increased from a 0.5 FTE position to a 1.0 FTE position beginning in 2024.

Be it further resolved by the Jackson County Board of Supervisors to authorize the Agriculture and Extension Education Committee and the Area Extension Director to revise and sign a new 136 contract for 2024 that reflects this change.

WHEREAS, Jackson County has lands enrolled as County Forest pursuant to s. 28.11 of the Wisconsin statutes, and;

WHEREAS, the County Board has the authority to acquire properties for the purpose of establishing County Forest land pursuant to ss. 28.10, Wis. Stats and as outlined in Chapter 400 of the Jackson County Forest Comprehensive Land Use Plan; and

WHEREAS, acquisition of said properties would perpetually provide forest products to our local economy, revenues to the County, outdoor recreation opportunities to the public, and improve property administration on the County Forest; and

WHEREAS, landowners Glen Klima Trust has approached Jackson County Forestry to donate a 1.42-acre parcel located in the Northwest Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section One, Township Twenty-two North, Range Three West, Town of Komensky, Jackson County Wisconsin, described as follows; the South 190 feet of the North 781 feet of the West 325.54 feet thereof. Tax Parcel No. 030-0566.0035.

WHEREAS, Glen Klima Trust is willing to donate the parcel if Jackson County pays the taxes and all closing costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Jackson County Board of Supervisors approves the donation of the 1.42-acre parcel for \$103.34 in taxes and closing costs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 1.42-acre parcel will be entered into the Jackson County Forest under special use upon the completion of the transaction, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Jackson County Clerk has the authority to sign documents to complete the transactions on behalf of Jackson County.

TO: The Honorable Members of the Jackson County Board of Supervisors

RE: Establishing Total Annual Compensation for County Clerk, Register of Deeds, and Treasurer Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 59.22

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 59.22 (1), the Board must establish the total annual compensation for services to be paid to the County Clerk, Register of Deeds and Treasurer prior to the earliest time for filing nomination papers for the county elective office; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to establish the total annual compensation for these elected officials, which is separate and distinct from the fringe benefits offered by the County to elected officials, and which fringe benefits are subject to increase or decrease during the officer's term at the discretion of the Board and in accordance with state and federal law; and

WHEREAS, as part of the County's fringe benefit program, county elected officials may participate in the Wisconsin Retirement System in accordance with state law; and

WHEREAS, as part of the County's fringe benefit program, county elected officials may elect to receive health insurance coverage under the same terms and conditions as the health insurance coverage offered to other Jackson County employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Jackson County Board of Supervisors, that the total annual compensation for county elected officers under Wis. Stat. § 59.22(1) shall be as follows and will also include the annual cost of living adjustment determined by the Executive and Finance Committee, effective on the first day of a term of office that begins after the date of this Resolution:

Resolution: 11-03-2024

REQUEST FOR STATE LEGISLATURE ACTION TO STOP UNFUNDED MANDATES FROM THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, OR INCORPORATE AND FUND THEIR IMPLEMENTATION

WHEREAS, Wisconsin Administrative Code, DOC 350.04, requires the construction and remodeling of county jails to be approved by the state Department of Corrections to ensure all state statutory requirements are met; and

WHEREAS, after the construction of county jails, the state Department of Corrections has used annual jail inspections to impose facility changes that are not supported by state statute and funded by state appropriations; and

WHEREAS, state jail inspections have required the expansion of jail medical treatment and examination rooms beyond their originally state approved designs without the statutory support or funding to do so; and

WHEREAS, state jail inspections have required the addition of jail programming staff and the expansion of programming rooms beyond the original jail designs without the statutory support or funding to do so; and

WHEREAS, state jail inspections have added quarantine requirements to jail cells that are not specified in state statute, which necessitate expensive facility redesign and expansion to accomplish; and

WHEREAS, state jail inspections have invoked a 30 year replacement criteria for county jails that significantly reduces the life expectancy of facilities designed to last over 50 years; and

WHEREAS, state jail inspections have imposed requirements to increase the number of jail receiving cells beyond the facility's state approved design that are not supported by statute or the funding to do so; and

WHEREAS, state jail inspections have imposed the inmate classification requirements of the federal Prison Rape Elimination Act before this act has been incorporated into state code, thereby forcing counties to make costly process changes without the state funding to do so; and

WHEREAS, the actions of state jail inspectors to mandate unfunded facility changes that are not supported by state statutory code places many millions of dollars of financial burden on the county tax levy and could cause the early retirement of facilities that are in compliance with state statutes.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Jackson County Board of Supervisors considers it inappropriate for the state Department of Corrections jail inspectors to impose unfunded mandates not supported by state code to facilities previously approved by the State Department of Corrections to meet code; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Jackson County Board of Supervisors calls on the state legislative oversight committee of the Department of Corrections to investigate the unfunded mandates being imposed by the Department of Corrections inspections

division, in order to adopt the mandates into state statute and fund their implementation, and/or to restrain the department's mandates, as appropriate; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this resolution be submitted to the Wisconsin Association of Counties for evaluation and action by the Association during the 2024 convention.

WITHDRAWAL OF LANDS FROM THE COUNTY FOREST

TO THE HONORABLE JACKSON COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS:

WHEREAS, Dairyland Power Cooperative is looking for a site to construct a 20-acre solar field to lease for 30 years,

WHEREAS, the site requires proximity to an electrical substation and to existing electrical infrastructure,

WHEREAS, there is a County Forest parcel that fits the criteria as described below:

The East Half of the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of Section 6, Township 21 North, Range 3 West, Town of Brockway, Jackson County, Wisconsin.

WHEREAS, Dairyland Power Cooperative wishes to lease the 20-acre parcel from Jackson County Forest for a period of time and has a payment schedule and lease for the site, with materials terms as follows:

1. Initial lease for twenty years and an option to lease for additional ten years.
2. Lease payments will be \$750 per acre per year for the first twenty years and will go up to \$1000 per acre per year for the next ten years.

WHEREAS, payments from the lease will be deposited in the Land Acquisition Account for future land purchases, and

WHEREAS, the solar field parcel must be withdrawn from the County Forest Law before this lease can be exercised,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR JACKSON COUNTY AS FOLLOWS: that Jackson County make application to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for withdrawal of the above-described parcels within the provisions of Chapter 28.11, Wisconsin Statutes.
